- 5. Approved helmets with harness must be worn by all Jr. riders when mounted and all riders over fences.
- 6. All entries must be serviceably sound or they will not be judged.
- 7. First three placings in qualifying classes must show back in champion-ship or forfeit previous winnings.
- 8. Tack hold will be 3 minutes and should be requested 2 classes ahead.
- 9. All Morgan Horses shown must be registered with Canadian National Livestock Records, or if under 1 yr. of age must be eligible for registration.
 - Papers must be available upon request. Foreign owned horses must be registered with the appropriate registry.
- 10. All appliances or devices (chains, rattles, etc.) are prohibited on grounds.
- 11. All exhibitors must pay gate admission, which includes entry for show. (There is no additional entry fee).
- 12. <u>No entry will be accepted day of show</u>. If you are interested in a class, please enter it's easy to scratch.
- 13. No cross entry between classes for any horse or pony unless specified.
- 14. Animals not under sufficient control shall not be allowed to compete.

RULES FOR PONY PULLING CONTEST

- 1. A person may enter and drive as many teams as he/she likes in each class.
- 2. A team or horse may draw in one class only.
- 3. A teamster is allowed two helpers if he so desires.
- No interference whatsoever by the helpers while horses are drawing, or draw disqualified.
- Teamsters or helpers are not allowed at horses heads while hitching or drawing.
- No cursing, swinging lines, beating horses with ends of lines while hitched or drawing.
- Teamsters and helpers are to stay behind whiffletrees while horses are drawing.
- 8. Teamsters and helpers are not allowed to touch, push or slap horses with hands.
- 9. No check slaps allowed.
- 10. In case of break in harness, time to repair determined by the Judge.
- 11. Two complete draws of 15 feet required. There will be 2 tries to pull the load 15 feet. The horses while pulling, must stay within the course lines or be disqualified from that try only.
- 12. Any movement under 4 inches will be considered a chuck if the teamster is trying to hold team and this will not be considered a pull.
- 13. Two passes in front of the boat will constitute one try.
- Teamster, upon entering the pull area has 2 minutes to hitch and 4 minutes to complete pull.
- Any teamster or helper arguing with the judge will automatically be ejected from contest.
- 16. Once a team has a draw, that teamster remain teamster for balance of the contest.
- 17. <u>ALL PULLERS MUST SHOW PROOF OF INSURANCE.</u>
- 18. All teamsters and helpers must be properly dressed for the occasion.
- 19. All decisions made by the judge are final.
- 20. Lightweight Class teams combined girth is 165 inches or less.
- 21. Heavyweight Class teams combined girth is more than 165 inches.
- 22. Entries must be pre-registered & membership paid before participating in the pull.
- 23. Prize money will be FORFEITED if puller not registered before entering the competition.
- 24. Any team considered dangerous by the judge /pull committee will be disqualified.
- 25. Once the team enters the pulling area for the first pull, and if they have blinders on, they must remain on, and if they are open, they must stay that way.

Best Teamster from Heavy Horse – plaque donated In Memory of Lorne Elder Central Canadian Horse Pulling Association - Rules

- 1. Owner & Teamster must be participating members of the CCHPA in good standing
- 2. No alcoholic beverages, prods or electrical devises used by teamster, helpers or officials
- 3. Sidelines twenty (20) feet apart. Each team allowed two (2) attempts to pull the load fifteen (15) feet. The horses, while pulling, must stay within lines of course, or disqualified from that try only. If stone boat is within 36 inches from the line, next contestant can request the boat be centered. A qualified Judge and Pin Person at each contest. The stone boat shall be pulled in same direction for all teams. However, the stone boat may be pulled in both directions for the first two (2) rounds.
- 4. Team enters the pulling area, with blinders on or without. No adjustments allowed for duration.
- 5. No team to be left unattended. Teamsters have option of passing the first load only.
- 6. If teamster climbs onto the boat while horses are hitched must remain on for that pull only
- A break in harness or equipment, Judge determines if teamster is allowed 5 minutes repair or be moved to end of the class. Has option of keeping distance gained on pull when break occurred.
- 8. Only one teamster. Each team one helper (hooker) but no more than two. If teamster becomes injured or ill, it must be reported to judge prior to the change.
- 9. Teamster and helpers must stay behind the doubletrees. No interference from the helpers.
- 10. Teamster disqualified if guilty of slashing team with lines, profane language or abuse of horses.
- 11. Team unmanageable or dangerous to the public, disqualified and drug testing may apply.
- 12. A teamster trying to hold his team, any distance under 6 inches is a "chuck" distance discounted
- 13. In pull area teamster, 2 minutes to hitch and 4 minutes to complete two attempts
- 14. Pulling order drawn prior to start. Horse pulls in one class only per competition
- 15. Officials and contestants only allowed in course area. Judge's decision is final. Failure to comply results in disqualification. Violation of rules also results in disqualification
- **16.** In case of a tie, boat pulled back to start line and each team to make one pull on the typing load, with the furthest distance taking the higher placing.
- All Teamsters/owners shall have proof of current liability insurance for horse pulling in the amount of \$2,000,000.00
- 18. Prize money FORFEITED if puller not registered before the competition begins !!!
